What is your role at CPCS and how long have you been a poison expert?

I have been a Toxicology Management Specialist for 22 years. I provide triage and treatment advice for poisonings and drug overdose for patients and health care professionals through our Poison Hotline.

Tell us about yourself: In my role as a pharmacist trained in toxicology, I constantly review the medical literature. This improves my knowledge to give better advice to patients and leads to better patient outcomes. I have worked on

numerous research projects, presented information at toxicology meetings, and authored/co-authored several publications. This helps improve the information we give to callers.

Ben authored/co-authored Investigating the Reliability of Substance Toxicity Information Found on the Internet in Pediatric Poisonings and Seizure in a Child After an Acute Ingestion of Levothyroxine, publications found in the National Institute of Health, National Library of Medicine—helping to improve patient care and treatment.
